#### College Visits Begin This Week!

Between now and November representatives from over 100 colleges and universities will visit our school. All 11th and 12th grade students have an opportunity to talk in small groups with the visiting representatives. Since these conferences are time-consuming students should be selective in choosing which visits to attend. Military representatives also visit frequently and are available through individual requests.

Parents and students should view the list of visiting colleges in Naviance under the Colleges tab. When students add colleges of interest and/or colleges they are applying to, Naviance will automatically send an email if this college has scheduled a visit. It is very important that students check their student email and login to Naviance on a regular basis during the school year to keep abreast of upcoming events and deadlines. College visit information will also be available on the TV screens in the cafeteria and on the morning announcements.

#### As a reminder, the following are the Student Responsibilities for attending college meetings:

Students must sign in on iPad when attending a college meeting. This verifies your attendance at the college meeting.

Students must secure the approval of the teacher whose class will be missed prior to the meeting.

Prior to the meeting, students should read about the particular college in Naviance to gather facts and information about the school and SIGN UP in Naviance if they plan to attend.

Students should have some questions in mind to ask the representative.

It is the student's responsibility to make up class work missed as a result of attendance at college meetings.

College meetings are to be taken seriously and are an excellent opportunity to determine if the college may be a good fit for you!









## College Board Recommendations from the Counseling Office

The Counseling Department recommends that all students consider taking the ACT at least once during their Junior year. In general, we agree with the UNC's recommendations: University of North Carolina "News and Updates for School Counselors" April 1, 2015. "As you know, the redesigned PSAT and SAT will be offered for the first time in October 2015 and March 2016 respectively. In anticipation of this change, many students, parents, and counselors have asked our advice regarding which version of the test students should take. Students who will be juniors during the 2015-16 academic year should take the new PSAT in October 2015 and the new SAT in March 2016. The College Board will provide a concordance table to assist colleges in comparing the "old" and "new" scores."

The new PSAT will be given on Wednesday, October 14, 2015. All 10th and 11th graders will take the test during the school day. There are no student fees or need to pre-register. The school district will be providing the test for each 10th and 11th grader. Watch for more information on this from Mr. McFeeley's office in the near future.

The **current SAT** will be administered in October, November, December and for the final time in January 2016.

The redesigned SAT will be administered starting March 2016.

Class of 2017 can take the current SAT through January 2016 and/or the redesigned SAT beginning March 2016.

Class of 2018 and beyond will <u>only</u> take the redesigned SAT.

Practice materials for the redesigned SAT are now live on **KhanAcademy.org**, making free, world-class, personalized online practice available for all students.

# Thinking About College?

For Seniors, college may be right around the corner. It's not too early to get yourself acquainted with some of things you'll need to sail through the process a little more smoothly.

The Federal Student Aid website has FAQs on the FSA ID and a link to create your ID in order to complete the FAFSA Application.

You might want to read this article before you go to a College Fair to help you navigate the fair most efficiently.

The Obama administration recently released a redesigned online tool with college-specific information about student costs, loans and potential earning power. The College Scorecard provides a snapshot of what former students at each school might earn, how much debt they leave with and what percentage can repay their loans. Students can conduct searches based on location, size, name of school, programs and degrees, etc. and gain information on costs, financial aid & debt, retention rate and earnings after graduation. An additional resource for evaluating college affordability and productivity is available through The Center for College Affordability and Productivity. Both of these websites share a great deal of data on costs of a post-secondary education. You will also find a variety of college rankings like American's Best Colleges (Forbes) to Money Magazine's College Rankings on the CCAP website.

# Senior Meetings

Counselors met with seniors the second week of school to discuss the college application process. This meeting included how to use the common application to submit applications to member colleges, how to use Naviance to request transcripts and letters of recommendation, test scores from College Board and ACT, and other important details.
